SWIM SAFE

Swim Safe teaches children aged 7-14 essential water safety skills through a fun session delivered by trained instructors. Children learn where is safe to swim, how to float, what to do if something goes wrong and how to call for help if someone else is in trouble. The RNLI want every child to have access to a free Swim Safe session so they have the opportunity to learn the skills to help them stay safe in and around open water. Children get to enjoy a fun, structured swimming session at a choice of open water locations – and learn all about how to stay safe.

The 60-minute session is run by qualified lifeguards and instructors, and includes:

- Beach safety advice provided by qualified lifeguards on land.
- Up to 30 minutes in-water tuition with qualified instructors.
- All the right kit for swimming outdoors (including swimming hats, wetsuits, and swimming aids)

Swim Safe is open to children aged 7-14. To take part, they must be able to swim a minimum of 25 metres. This is usually achieved by Year 4 at Heslerton CE and is the national standard by the end of Year 6. A parent or guardian must be present throughout the session. These sessions book up quickly. SCHOOL SHOE DONATION

In a few weeks, the school will close and events will be held to mark the end of this academic year. Before the children leave to enjoy their long summer holiday, we want to ask them (and you) to change another child's life on the way out . . .

We ask that at the end of the last day of term, Friday 20 July, those children that wish to (and have an adult's permission to do so) take their school shoes off and place them on their desk and leave school barefoot.

We will give the donated shoes to a child in Africa via the wonderful work of the charity Sal's Shoes.

So those shoes, which are unlikely to be used again because feet grow over the summer or are a little scuffed so will be replaced in time for the new school year, won't just sit in the shoe cupboard getting in the way, but will have a second life.

We'd love for your child to take part.

A whole school leaving barefoot is a powerful message that we want to help those fellow school children who have no choice and leave school barefoot every day.

Please help us to help others who are less fortunate than ourselves.

P.S. Of course the children can bring in another pair of shoes to change into after walking out of school for their journey home; and if you have only recently purchased their school shoes perhaps your child has another pair of outgrown shoes they may wish to bring in and leave behind.

In 2017, just under 600 schools in the U.K. [alongside several schools worldwide] participated in Toe to Toe. Over 175,000 pairs of Sal's Shoes were donated.

WOODWIND TUITION

North Yorkshire County Council Music Service have been given a grant to increase instrumental playing in young people in our area and to help families with lower incomes to access the music service.

Targeted at children wishing to start playing a woodwind instrument, NYCC are offering free small group lessons (of 8) with free instrument hire.

The 30 minute sessions will be on Saturday mornings between 10.30 and 12.30 at Scarborough Sixth Form College, Sandybed Lane, Scarborough and will start in September.

Places will initially be offered to children from families entitled to free school meals and/or working tax credits initially; but open to all.

Instrumental tuition for clarinet, flute and saxophone is being offered. If your child is in current Y3, 4 & 5 and interested, please let the office know by Friday 15th June.
