

PUNCTUALITY

We have become aware that there are a number of children who are arriving late for school.

All schools use a national registration system to record, attendance, lateness and absences. This complies with Government and L.A. guidelines.

School's official starting time is 8.45 am, pupils arriving after this time should report to the school office. Any child arriving between the start of school and 8.55am, when registration closes, will be registered with a late mark. Those arriving after this time will be marked with unauthorised absence for the session unless a reason is given. School may then, following NYCC guidance, authorise this lateness. It is important that pupils are punctual and arrive prepared for the day's learning. If you have a problem in the morning which means you will be late, please phone school to make us aware.

WELLIES

During the wet, wintry weather, only pupils with wellies will be allowed to play in the field. This will ensure classes can join together on the carpet in class time and keep clean.

CHRISTMAS FEEDBACK

Thank you for your feedback on the Christmas play and nativity.

The nativity services were well received. The parental attendance was high and it was suggested by many families that 2 services continue in future years for all to view this. The focus on younger pupils was enjoyed. Parents were pleased to see younger siblings at church. They asked if we could encourage pre-schoolers to sit quietly during readings and prayers. We will host two services at church next Christmas. Again we will encourage younger siblings to attend the afternoon service. This will help them to experience worship at church and allow adults quiet prayer or reflection time during the evening service.

The Christmas play was enjoyed by all. The length of the play was judged to be better and pupils enjoyed taking part. Parents commented positively upon pupils writing their parts, making the parts as big or small as they felt capable. Containing this production to 1 focussed week was also praised. As the play takes place at such a busy time of year, some pupils were very tired, some parents were busy with other siblings' events and some parents missed information about where to drop their children. Older family members struggled with the lack of street lighting. In the summer term 2018, we will write and produce a play, focussing upon the older pupils for the end of the Summer, after national tests. Dave Webb will work with us to produce a summer spectacular. We will collect parent views after this, in Summer 2018.
