

# PUPIL PREMIUM GRANT EXPENDITURE REPORT TO PARENTS AND GOVERNORS 2012- 2013

## Principles

- Teaching and learning opportunities are planned to meet the needs of all of the pupils.
- Appropriate provision is made to meet the needs of pupils who belong to vulnerable groups, including socially disadvantaged pupils.
- We recognise that not all pupils who receive free school meals will be socially disadvantaged.
- We also recognise that not all pupils who are socially disadvantaged are registered or qualify for free school meals.
- We reserve the right to allocate the Pupil Premium funding to support any pupil or groups of pupils the school has legitimately identified as being socially disadvantaged.
- Pupil premium funding will be directed towards priority classes, groups or individuals. Limited funding and resources may mean that not all children receiving free school meals will access pupils premium funded provision at one time.

## Provision

- Governors may choose to use the funding to finance the following provision based upon individual need:
  - Reduce class sizes to improve opportunities for accelerating progress
  - Provide group work for small groups of identified pupils with an experienced teacher focussed on specific gaps in learning
  - 1-1 support
  - Additional targeted teaching and learning opportunities with trained TAs, specialist staff or external agencies
  - Provide greater opportunities for staff to liaise with parents/carers to ensure pupils are fully supported in all aspects of school life
  - Acquiring effective materials aimed at raising standards, particularly in reading, writing and maths
- All pupil premium funding will be aimed at accelerating pupil progress to at least age related expectations. Initially this will be in Literacy and Numeracy.
- Pupil premium resources may also be used to target able children on FSM to achieve L3 at the end of KS1 or L5/6 at the end of KS2.
- The Governors of the school will publish information on how they have used their Pupil Premium Grant to address the issue of "closing the gap", for socially disadvantaged children

## Allocation

The Governors have targeted the PPG to run classes of no more than 24 students this past school year:

## Impact

The impact of the PPG for 2012/13 was that FSM pupils maintained an attendance rate of >92%, an increase on previous years. KS2 pupils who were awarded pupil premium funding attained the national Level 4 standard and made expected progress in reading and writing. EYFS pupils met expected standards in most EYFS areas.
