

## PUPIL PREMIUM GRANT EXPENDITURE REPORT 2014- 2015

### Principles

- Teaching and learning opportunities are planned to meet the needs of all pupils.
- Appropriate provision is made to meet the needs of pupils who belong to vulnerable groups, including socially disadvantaged pupils.
- We recognise that not all pupils who receive free school meals will be socially disadvantaged.
- We also recognise that not all pupils who are socially disadvantaged are registered or qualify for pupil premium funding.
- We reserve the right to allocate the Pupil Premium funding to support any pupil or groups of pupils the school has legitimately identified as being disadvantaged.
- Pupil premium funding will be directed towards priority classes, groups or individuals. Limited funding and resources may mean that not all children receiving free school meals will access pupil premium funded provision at one time.

### Provision

- Governors may choose to use the funding to finance the following provision based upon individual need:
  - Reduce class sizes to improve opportunities for accelerating progress
  - Provide group work for small groups of identified pupils with an experienced teacher focussed on specific gaps in learning
  - 1-1 support
  - Additional targeted teaching and learning opportunities with trained TAs, specialist staff or external agencies
  - Provide greater opportunities for staff to liaise with parents/carers to ensure pupils are fully supported in all aspects of school life
  - Acquiring effective materials aimed at raising standards, particularly in reading, writing and maths
- All pupil premium funding will be aimed at accelerating pupil progress to at least age related expectations. Initially this will be in Literacy and Numeracy.
- Pupil premium resources may also be used to ensure able children on FSM achieve at least age expected standards at the end of each school year.

### Allocation

The Governors have targeted the PPG to run 2 classes this past school year, each supported by a Full time TA:

### Impact

- The impact of the PPG for 2013/14 was that FSM pupils on roll July 2015 increased attendance rates from the previous academic year.
- Pupils attracting Pupil Premium funding who are tracked on the school assessment system made expected or better progress in reading, writing and maths.
- Pupils awarded Pupil Premium funding who are tracked on P Scales made notable progress at a lower rate than the overall national average.
